## WHAT IS JOB CORPS?

A residential career training and education program for low-income young people ages 16 through 24.

At Job Corps, women can:

- Receive hands-on training in careers in high-growth industries.
- Earn a high school diploma or high school equivalency credential.
- Participate in on-the-job training in more than 100 career areas.
- Apply for Advanced Training in specialized areas after completing a general career training area.
- Receive career transition support for up to 21 months after graduation and get help finding a job and adjusting to an independent lifestyle.
